



## Bogusława Drelich-Skulska

Professor dr hab. Bogusława Drelich-Skulska is a Vice-Rector for International Cooperation at Wrocław University of Economics. She also heads the Department of International Economic Relations at Wrocław University of Economics.

Bogusława Drelich-Skulska is Professor of Economics. Her special field of interest is international economic relations, foreign trade and development economics, with particular focus on economic policy issues in selected East Asian countries. Prof. Drelich-Skulska is the author and co-author of 10 books and 80 articles in Polish and English concerning the issues of economic regionalism in East Asia, foreign economic policy of Japan, clustering in India and Japan. Professor Drelich-Skulska was a visiting research fellow at the Center for Asian and Pacific Studies (CAPS), Seikei University, Tokyo, Japan (2012). She also lectured at many foreign universities around the world being a visiting professor at the universities in Australia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany and Switzerland.

What is more prof. Drelich-Skulska was a manager and contractor of the international projects "New regionalism in East Asia. Evolution-institutionalization-entities" (2011-2013) and "Clusters as an innovation carrier of enterprises and regions. Verification and implementation of Asian models in terms of the Polish economy" (2011-2014), both projects funded by the Polish National Science Centre. She is also the originator and organizer of the series of international "Asia-Pacific" scientific conferences addressing economic, political and social problems in this region of the world, which have been taking place since 2007. On her initiative, in 2011, the Center for Asia-Pacific Research was established at the university.

Prof. Drelich-Skulska performed important functions at the Wrocław University of Economics as a vice-dean for didactics and full-time studies at the Faculty of Economic Sciences (2005-2012) and managing the International Cooperation Office at the Wrocław University of Economics (2012-2016). She has also an experience in performing functions in national and international associations being a deputy of the Central Europe in the European Association for Southeast Asian Studies Board 2010-2013 (EuroSEAS), a deputy in the Polish Society of International Studies Board (2014-2020) and a deputy in the Polish Economic Society Board (2015-2018).
