Michael John Page is the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Bentley University in Massachusetts, United States of America. Before joining Bentley, he served as the Dean of Post-Experience Programs of RSM Erasmus University and as the Executive Director of the Rotterdam School of Management B.V., The Netherlands. Previously he was the Dean of Rotterdam School of Management, Erasmus Graduate School of Business, and also served a term as its Dean of Academic Affairs. Mike joined Erasmus after sixteen years at the Graduate School of Business of the University of Cape Town, South Africa where he also held the Len Abrahamse Chair in Finance.

Professor Page serves on the boards of the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD), the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB, International), and South Africa Partners. He serves on the AACSB's Committee for Issues in Management Education (CIME), is a past chair of its Initial Accreditation Committee (IAC), and was a member of the International Blue Ribbon Committee on Accreditation Quality that developed the new accreditation standards. He is also actively engaged with the international management education industry, including serving on and chairing well over thirty accreditation visits for AACSB, EQUIS, and AMBA, as well as supporting development activities offered by the Central and Eastern European Management Development Association (CEEMAN). He serves on advisory boards for Nagoya University of Commerce and Business (Japan), Cape Town University's Graduate School of Business (South Africa), Chulalongkorn University's Sasin Graduate Institute of Business Administration (Thailand), École Nationale des Ponts et Chaussées (ENPC) School of Management, Paris (France), and the Russian Presidential Academy of National Economy and Public Administration, Moscow (Russia).

Professor Page holds a BSc (Engineering) from Natal University, Durban, South Africa and an MBA and PhD from the University of Cape Town, South Africa. He has held professorial appointments at Henley Management College in the United Kingdom, the Graduate School of Business at Stellenbosch University in South Africa, and at Erasmus University, The Netherlands. For a period of time he also worked as Consultant Advisor in Investec Asset Management, South Africa/UK. Professor Page joined Bentley University in 2008 as the Dean of Business and of the McCallum Graduate School of Business and was appointed to his current position in 2009. He continues to be research active, and holds professorships in Finance and Management at Bentley University, as well as an extraordinary professorship at the Graduate School of Business at Stellenbosch University.
