Aurora Díaz-Soloaga, MSM, is a Senior Lecturer at the School of Management (AlmaU), where she teaches Leadership, Corporate Social Responsibility, and Global Management, among other subjects. In 2022, she was named the CEEMAN Teacher of the Year. She enriches her classes with an active approach, promoting a sense of transformative education and advocating for Responsible Management Education in the eclectic environment of Kazakhstan and Central Asia. Due to her commitment, Aurora has become an active member of the Expert Pedagogy Group of the Impactful-5 (i5), the flagship project of the platform "Principles of Responsible Management in Education" (PRME) — a United Nations Global Compact initiative. She represents the PRME Eurasian Chapter among 20 experts from around the world.
