She conducted evaluations in health, energy, finance, and other sectors.

In 2005, she was invited to Kazakhstan to serve as the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and Board Member of JSC National Company "KazMunaiTeniz," focusing on financing projects such as Kashagan and other oil and gas ventures. From 2013 to 2018, she worked as CFO/Board Member of NMH "Baiterek," where she also supervised IT and Strategy departments.
