Gazi is an Albanian-born international serial business entrepreneur with extensive experience of identifying opportunities and establishing companies in diverse industry segments and markets. His current business activities include the Albania franchises for AVIS, Budget Rent a Car, and distribution for Opel. He is the owner of Landways International (previously the Albania Experience) – an Incentive, Event and Travel Company, which handles over 60,000 visitors travelling into Europe each year, with offices in Albania, Croatia and plans for Asia. Most recently he has become the Land and Port handling agent for MSC Cruises who now regularly dock in Albania. He has also established the Albanian Driver trainer centre ensuring a higher class of safety awareness and driving skills for major fleets travelling within Albania and internationally. He is a co-founder and shareowner of the POLIS University in Tirana offering degrees in Architecture, Urban Planning and Art and Design and used to be the Licence Proprietor of "In Your Pocket" guidebooks of Tirana, Skopje, Pristine and Podgorica. He was elected as A Young Global Leader from DAVOS World Economic Summit in 2008 and is an active member of that community.
