

Ian Sutherland

Born and raised in Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada, Dr. Ian Sutherland is Deputy Dean for Research and Director of PhD Studies at IEDC–Bled School of Management in Slovenia. An internationally recognized expert at the intersection of arts and business, Dr. Sutherland was originally trained as a professional musician. He holds B.Mus. (Hons) and M. Mus. Degrees from the School of Music of Memorial University (Canada) and a PhD in Sociology and Philosophy from the University of Exeter (UK). Today he has an active international career as a researcher, educator and consultant combining expertise in sociology, philosophy, creativity and leadership studies. In addition to his position at IEDC-Bled School of Management, he is also, Fellow of the School of Graduate Studies of Memorial University, and Fellow of the Peter Pribilla Stiftung – Technische Universität München. A sought after speaker and facilitator he has delivered courses, workshops, seminars and lectures in over 20 countries around the world. As a consultant and organizational development practitioner he has worked with companies in the pharmaceuticals, consumer electronics, telecommunications, financial services, manufacturing and defense industries.

Dr. Sutherland's work occurs at the intersection of the arts and business. In particular his work is focused on leadership practice, creative and strategic processes, leveraging diversity and experiential arts-based methods of management and leadership development. He is a co-founding editor of the journal Music and Arts in Action and the author/co-author of articles appearing in *Management Learning; Organizational Aesthetics; Business Leadership Review; Journal of Arts Management, Law and Society; Emotion Review; Journal of Visual Art Practice; Music and Arts in Action.* He is also co-author of the book *Key Concepts in Leadership* (Sage, 2012) with Prof. Jonathan Gosling and Dr. Stephanie Jones, and contributor (chapter on leadership, together with Prof. Danica Purg) to a book *Hidden Champions in CEE and Turkey – Carving a Global Niche* (Springer, 2013). Prior to joining IEDC-Bled School of Management he held appointments as Associate Research Fellow at the University of Exeter's Centre for Leadership Studies and Assistant Professor at Memorial University, Canada.
